*Good Work Amelia Bedelia* ER Par. Literal-minded Amelia Bedelia does household chores and gets dinner ready.

*Green Eggs and Ham.* ER Seu. Dr. Seuss's classic "try it, you'll like it" tale about Sam I Am and his hatred for green eggs and ham.

*Henry and Mudge and the funny lunch.* ER Ryl. Mudge looks forward to the Mother's Day surprise that Henry and his father cook up for Henry's mother.

*How Many Ants?* ER Bri. Ants increase by multiples of ten as they march up the hill toward a tall cake.

*The Little Red Hen.* ER Jon. The little red hen finds none of the lazy barnyard animals willing to help her plant, harvest, or grind wheat into flour, but all are eager to eat the bread she makes from it.

*Max Goes to a Cookout.* ER Kle. Max has a wonderful time when he accepts his friend Zoe's invitation to join her and her grandparents for dinner.

*Mouse Soup.* ER Lob. A mouse convinces a weasel he needs the ingredients from several stories to make a tasty mouse soup.

*Pickles in My Soup.* ER Pea. A girl loves to eat pickles in all kinds of unusual combinations.
